Award Descriptions

Chief's Award

The Chief's Award is presented to the chapter, in the judgment of the lodge chief, that has improved the most over the past year.

Roth Award

The William Stanley Roth Award for Outstanding Chapter Service is given each year to the chapter that devotes the most service to the council, camps, community, and lodge. Over the course of the year, the chapter and its members accumulate points based on their participation in the aforementioned activities. The chapter with the most points wins the Roth Award.

Key 3 Award

Two youth and two adults are chosen annually by the Lodge Key 3 (Lodge Chief, Lodge Adviser, and Lodge Staff Adviser) as the recipients of this award. Recipients are awarded director's chairs.

Dancer Award

An award earned by a youth Arrowman dancer. Before turning 21, the recipient has made his own Native American dance outfit, has demonstrated knowledge of his dance style, and participated in a dance competition at the lodge, section, or national level.

Ceremonialist Award

An award earned by a youth Arrowman ceremonialist. Before turning 21, the recipient has made his own ceremony outfit, performed at least five ceremonies for the lodge, and participated in a ceremony competition at the lodge, section, or national level.

104 Service Award

An award given to any Arrowman, youth or adult, for providing service to the lodge. The award is given upon attainment of 104 service hours. This award may be earned multiple times within the same year.

Summer Camp Staffer Award

Given to active, dues-paying members of Occoneechee Lodge who serve on the Camp Durant summer camp staff. Recipients must work a minimum of three weeks during the summer and serve out their full contractual agreement.

Troop Service Award

An award given to those Arrowmen who remain active participants in their troops. There are eight requirements to be completed over the course of a year that include such things as contributing service to the troop and participating in troop outings and meetings.

The Distinguished Service Award was created in 1940 to honor those who rendered service to the Order beyond the lodge level. The award is presented to those Arrowmen who have rendered distinguished and outstanding service to the Order on a sectional, regional, or national basis. The award is presented every two to three years during the National Order of the Arrow Conference. Since the time the first awards were presented, less than 840 Distinguished Service Awards have been awarded.

The Year in Review – 2018-2019

Last fall, five members of Occoneechee Lodge were elected as Lodge Officers. These young men were Michael Glennon – Lodge Chief, Matthew Klassa – Vice Chief of Program, Matthew Gillespie – Vice Chief of Administration, Parker Morrissette – Vice Chief of Communications, Corey Rodgers – Vice Chief of Finance; and John Sommer, who reprised his role as 2019 Conclave Chairman. They were elected to lead the lodge throughout 2019 and their first event, Lodge Leadership Development (LLD), was only one short month after they were elected.

In November of 2018, the lodge, with its newly inducted leadership, spear headed by Matthew Klassa, hosted LLD at Campbell University. Participants received training in several different areas, including; Conducting a Project, Communication and Public Speaking, and plenty of AIA, Chapter, and Conclave meetings. The Executive Committee met to bond as an EC, collaborate on how to run effective chapter meetings and events, and determine the direction of the Lodge over the next year.

In December of 2018, Occoneechee lodge held its annual Winter Banquet at Camp Durant. The event was highlighted by each chapter providing a unique decorative wreath, plenty of special presentations, and our guest speaker, former National Chief Scout Executive Wayne Brock.The night closed on Past Chief Nicholas Anderson passing the Chiefs Bonnet to the new Lodge Chief Michael Glennon, who was joined by his Lodge Officers as they took the oath of office. A new Lodge year had begun!

Between December of 2018 and April of 2019, the Lodge spent hundreds of service hours preparing Camp Durant for the upcoming SR-7B Conclave. During this time, Arrowman from all over the Lodge gathered for five separate workdays and even more personal visits to provide service and maintenance to Camp Durant. These workdays included the installation of news stairs outside the Grand Lodge parking lot, a new bridge between STEM and the Activity Field, trench digging, bleacher repair and work on the Dance Arbor, and numerous other projects. Above all, the pinnacle of our member's hard work and commitment was the complete makeover of the Sullivan Center; which included new paint both on the inside and on the exterior of the building, a new floor, updated display cases, and the opening of the Occoneechee Lodge Museum. Thank you to everyone for donating so much of your personal time and energy and so much of yourselves to making sure that our Camp will look better for years to come.

Spring Pow-Wow in March featured plenty of exciting activities and even more opportunities for service as the Lodge prepared to host Conclave at Durant in April. Conclave, AIA competitions, service, the Ordeal, and Quest for the Golden Arrow were some of the many activities on every Arrowman's mind that weekend. The lasting memories of this event include the "Hotel Breakfast Battle" that the officers engaged in, Netopalis winning the Lodge Quest award and the Spirit Award, the Lodge Officers being put into the Dunk Tank at Thunderfest, and of course welcoming almost 200 new members into our Order.

On April 12th-14th, Section SR-7B arrived at Hotel Camp Durant and prepared for what Occoneechee Lodge had to offer. Headed by our fantastic Conclave Chairman and Advisor, John Sommer and Kevin Blackwood, we delivered. Almost 700 Arrowman from Lodge 104 combined with the rest of the Section to put on the largest Conclave in the nation and the second largest Scouting event in 2019 (just behind the World Jamboree). Thanks to all of your hard work and determination, this years Conclave was transformed into the absolute best Conclave this Section has seen in years. The event offered fantastic shows, mountain biking, Cope and Climbing, OAX, AIA competitions, and a whole lot of cheerful service as our lodge took the "Be Our Guest" theme to heart. The highlight of the event for many was when Occoneechee Lodge completed its goal of winning the Quest for the Golden Arrow award for a record sixth time in a row! Thank you to everyone who attended and staffed the event and an even bigger thank you to those behind the scenes who made this Conclave the success that it was.

Spring Inductions in May was an opportunity to relax after the two year marathon of preparing and hosting Conclave. The event featured returning programs such as us welcoming our new members through the Ordeal and plenty of service, but also featured a camp wide scavenger hunt, a Disk Golf tournament, a Basketball tournament, and a fantastic closing show and Thunderfest on Saturday night.

This summer at Camp Durant, represented by our OA Commissioner John Sommer and some of the best Arrowmen our Lodge has to offer, Lodge 104 took it upon ourselves to perform numerous tasks and responsibilities in service of our Camp. These included Monday nights when the Lodge hosted the OA Ice Cream Social, Wednesdays when we hosted the Brotherhood Trail where scouts that came to camp could complete the trail to seal their membership in the Lodge; and, lastly, on Friday evenings when we organized and performed weekly Call-out and Brotherhood ceremonies to assist Scouts as they progressed on their Scouting journeys.

Near the end of the summer, the Lodge Trading Post, Matt Breneman, and the AIA committee held the Annual Tradoree and Gentgeen events. It was here that Arrowman from across the country came to bond in fellowship through patch trading and feature their best and most valuable trades; meanwhile, Gentgeen offered an opportunity for returning and new Arrowman to learn together about ceremonies, bead work, the types of Dancing, and numerous other AIA traditions.

With the start of Fall brought our final massive Lodge event of the year, Fall Fellowship. It was here that Arrowman came together to provide service to their camp, welcome their news brothers as they completed their Ordeal, and seal their commitment to further membership by completing their Brotherhood Experience. Also at Fall Fellowship, five members were elected to be the Lodge Leadership for the 2020 year: Parker Morrissette as Lodge Chief, Alberto Daniel as Vice Chief of Program, Greg Koonce as Vice Chief of Administration, Dakota Cameron as Vice Chief of Communications, and Alejandro Reyes as Vice Chief of Finance.

During 2018 Occoneechee Lodge's members served their fellow scouts cheerfully. The Arrowmen of Occoneechee were always willing to take on new and seemingly daunting tasks even in the face of unpredictable challenges. I'm thrilled to announce that Occoneechee Lodge also received the level of Gold for the Journey To Excellence award! From the bottom of my heart, thank you to everyone for all the dedicated work you gave selflessly these past 12 months.

This past year I was honored to serve alongside you all as we bonded through Fellowship and Service. Your cheerfulness and selflessness inspired the Lodge and the Council as a whole this past year and it is because of you that we can call 2019 a success. Thank you all so much for contributing to the best Lodge in the nation and what has been the best program and Lodge year any Order of the Arrow Lodge in the nation has to offer. It has been an honor serving alongside you and I hope to see you all again next year.

Occoneechee Lodge began as an idea when Mr. Claude Humphreys recognized the potential of the Order of the Arrow at the 1937 National Jamboree. The application for membership was approved on August 30, 1937, and early in 1938 the new lodge members voted to take on the name of the Council; thus Lodge 104 became the Occoneechee Lodge. From that humble beginning over 70 years ago with 50 active Arrowmen, Occoneechee Lodge has grown into a vibrant, active Lodge with a roster of over 1,800 Scouts and Scouters.
