Welcome to the world of collecting Occoneechee Lodge 104 patches! Originally, this pictorial guide was developed to assist both old and novice collectors with the patch memorabilia issued by Occoneechee Lodge up to Fall Fellowship of 2012, our 75th Anniversary. However, it has become an on-going project updated annually. The guide may be used as both a quick reference guide to help identify the Lodge's issues or a checklist for needs and acquisitions.

Please note that some of the Blue Book designations do not correspond with the issues in this guide as they have been corrected. This primarily applies to the odd shapes (X) and event (e) sections of the guide.

Since our first flap (FF) was issued, the head coloration of thunderbird, the eyes, and tail configuration (or absence of a tail) has changed. For the novice collector, you may utilize this reference guide to determine which issue you have acquired or are looking to acquire, as all of the thunderbirds on our flaps look similar at first glance, but with a little study you may quickly determine the various issues.

- A-0.5 has no name or number and may be easily passed up by the collector. It was originally issued on a neckerchief around 1975.
- The A-1 service arrowhead is probably the toughest of the A's from the Lodge. Unissued/unearned arrowheads were burned.
- A-2 is distinguishable from the A-4a and A-4b by the presence of the "MGM Indian" head. The A-4a and A-4b are mostly distinguishable by the backing. The A-4a has a cloth backing (Southern Emblem) and the A-4b has a plastic backing (Shelby Patch). The A-4b was a remake in 2012 due to diminishing supply of this Troop Service Award patch.
- Durant Staff award arrowheads A-3a and A-3b are very similar except A-3b has a somewhat distorted "MGM Indian" head. Moritz Embroidery made the A-3b when the supply of the A-3a was depleted.
- A-8 and A-9 were made due to a depleted supply of the A-6 and A-7. Changes were needed to the
 patch due to the new BSA licensing rules requiring a full view of the FDL, so a totally new design of
 the patch was made.
- A-11 replaced the depleted supply of the A-3a/A-3b. The MGM Indian head could no longer be
 used, so it was replaced with the current OA arrowhead. A FDL also was added per BSA licensing
 requirements.

- A member and collector wanted the Lodge to do bullion, so they had a prototype made without the
 Lodge's approval. The prototype was similar in design to B-1. While the prototype angered the
 Lodge, it was decided that the Lodge would make a bullion as a fundraiser for the proposed Charley
 Sullivan Training Center. Since B-1 was the first bullion issue, the issue quickly sold out of the
 Trading Post.
- Due to the rapid sell of the **B-1**, bullions **B-2** and **B-3** were also be made as fundraisers for the Charley Sullivan Training Center. As some called the **B-1** a "Duke blue" bullion, the Lodge made an "NC State red" (**B-2**) and a "UNC blue" (**B-3**) bullion to satisfy rivalries.
- B-4 was a mistake in the B-3 color by Moritz Embroidery. The company offered the bullions to the Lodge at a greatly reduced price, so the Lodge purchased the bullions for having greater profitability and rather than having them potentially sold to outsiders.
- B-3 and B-4 did not sell as well as previous bullions, likely due to a saturated market.
- B-5a and B-5b were also mistakes as they were supposed to have a chenille background. Other issues surrounding this piece were the colors and the thunderbird's head was not embroidered. There was also an a/b variety within the lot as some had black in the antenna and others had a solid white antenna. Since the manufacturer (SymbolArts) did not supply us with what was originally specified in the order, they discounted it and the Lodge purchased it for issuance to protect our brand from aftermarket resale. The bullion was issued at 2016 Spring Inductions.

- C-1 has thus far been the only chenille made by Standard Pennant. The finer ink numbering on the backs of the C-1 both on the label and the back of the chenille was done by Standard Pennant. The thicker black ink (# X with X being a number) was done by the Lodge as an issued number. There were 200 chenille's issued by the Lodge.
- C-2 was a pre-order fundraiser chenille. Profits from this chenille were used to purchase the Gentgeen Award J-5 patches. Due to the low quantities produced, this is a very coveted patch.
- C-5 was a pre-order fundraiser for the J-17 HoKa award. It was sold in slightly higher numbers, possibly due to the scarcity of the C-2.
- C-6, C-7, C-8, and C-9 were Vigil chenille's made as a fund raiser for the Vigil Committee to help fund new Lodge Vigils. The original order quantity of C-6 was 150, but it quickly sold out. This angered some Vigil honor members so an additional 50 were made. Two hundred (200) chenille's were ordered for the remaining Vigil chenille's.
- C-11 was a pre-order only. Due to the quick sell-out of the M-3 at Spring Inductions, it was decided that a pre-order was the best way to go on this particular chenille. Only 100 of the C-11 were made. This one will be a rarity in the future.
- QC-1 is the only "Q" issue from the Lodge. This issue began as a mistake of C-8 by the manufacturer. Moritz Embroidery gave these to the Lodge at no cost to do whatever the Lodge wanted to do with the patches. They looked so bad, the Lodge decided to destroy them rather than issue them to its members. The Lodge Chief at the time apparently did not trust the Lodge Adviser nor the Patch Committee Adviser to destroy them as they were both collectors, so the Chief took them to cut them in half. Ultimately, they never got destroyed. In speaking with the Chief years later, he had just put them away in his closet while attending Campbell University. Upon moving out, he discovered the chenilles that he was supposed to have destroyed, and decided to toss them in a dumpster instead where nobody would recover them. Well guess what? They were found by a dumpster diver and given to a well-known collector as they were thought to possibly be something important that had been mistakenly trashed.

- F-3 was a one-time run of the Lodge's Ordeal flap. It is said that there are only 200 of this run, which contained a twill left and a till right variation.
- If not carefully observed by the collector, F-4, F-5, and F-6 look to be fully embroidered. They are not as there is a small area of tackle twill on them. The tackle twill was used to simulate the ice on the patch.
- F-13 and F-14 were designed to have the top part of the pig cut out above the top of the border. BSA Licensing would not approve the design, so the border was moved up, creating a larger patch size.
- F-15 is embroidered on pleather or faux leather, which is a simulated leather product. There were two runs of this "F", creating the slight difference in the green thread in the tail.
- Occoneechee Lodge has been a leader in staying on the cutting edge of different patches, thus the
 F-17 rubber flap, the first of its kind starting a trend for other Lodge's to follow. This flap was
 designed to be a part of the "Caveman" theme for the 2011 SR-7B conclave. The flap has pins
 embedded on the back of the flap, thus it would allow the conclave delegates to pin the flap on for
 instant conclave spirit. Some Lodge members dubbed the rubber flap as the "Hershey Bar" flap due
 to it resembling a candy bar.
- The F-19, F-20, and F-21 "Tobacco Road Home of Champions" set came about after the loss of UNC in the 2016 NCAA basketball tournament. Several brothers realized just how many times our state had a championship team . . . way more than any other state in the nation. Jon Stewart had the idea of using a basketball faux leather material for the background of this set and it finally came together during the summer of 2016 as the Lodge had to order the material and have it shipped to the manufacturer, Moritz Embroidery.
- F-22 is made of wood and laser etched. It was made utilizing the W-13 80th anniversary design. This piece was not made to be worn, but some added magnets to the back of this flap to wear on their uniform, so it's a collect as you see fit issue.
- F-30, the "Contest Flap" was a colored-in winning version of the S-189. Youth that participated in the contest used colored marker pens to colorize the S-189 flap creating their own design. The winning design was made and sold at the 2022 Winter Banquet

- J-1 and J-2 are believed to have been made by one of the Lodge's Chapters in the Fayetteville area. Many collectors do not consider this an issue of Lodge. J-2 issues are individually numbered.
- J-3, J-4, and J-7 look very similar as they are approximately the same size, just varying a few mm's difference. Actually, it can very easily be determined what the difference is between these three issues. The J-3 utilized the Swiss Embroidery process or old-style embroidery. The J-4 and the J-7 are computer designed (CD) but J-4 has a cloth back while J-7 has a plastic back.
- The original HoKa J-17 award patch was never issued as an award. The manufacturer apparently released the over-runs to someone in Arizona who in-turn began selling them on eBay. Lodge collectors not having one quickly began paying high prices to get one of these in their collection, later learning that not even the first J-17 had been issued. The Lodge was angered by the over-run sells and wanted to put a stop to the Arizona seller. Pleas to the seller to stop the sales fell on deaf ears and with no regular Lodge event with in several months to sell the HoKa's to Lodge members in the Trading Post and stop the eBay sellers profitability, the Lodge consigned the Lodge's supply of HoKa's to Brush Creek Trading to compete with the Arizona seller. This put the money back into the Lodge's hands and also stopped the unauthorized seller from obtaining their high profits. J-22 is the Hoka that was issued as the drummer/singer award patch until 2023 when that program was ended due to changes at the national level. Approximately 13 awards were issued and the remaining patches were sold in the Trading Post at the 2023 Fall Fellowship.
- J-28 "beaded" look jacket patch was made in the Spring of 2018 soon after the death of one of the Lodge's premier beaders, and Trading Post staffer Glenn Parler. The patch was originally intended to be used for the Lodge's 80th anniversary in 2017, however due to other designs being utilized and much to Glenn's disappointment, the beaded look patch was not made in 2017. It was issued at 2018 Pow-Wow in honor of Glenn.
- The J-30 is awarded by the Lodge's adult advisers at each of the Lodge events to those who show innovative or creative ideas in service.

- L-1, L-2, and L-5 are issued to Vigil candidates at the Vigil call-out ceremony and then replaced with a personalized one at the Vigil recipient's ceremony.
 L-1 has a silk-screened design while L-2 and L-5 have a stamped design.
- L-3 is a branding coaster designed for 2015 ArrowTour. The buyer could use a branding iron to brand 3 different 100th Anniversary logos on the back of the coaster.
- L-4 was issued for the 2020 SR-7B Conclave as the delegate flap alongside the trader flap S-175.
 The event cancelled due to COVID-19.
- L-5 was first issued to the 2021 Vigil recipients at Vigil Gathering that year due to a depleted supply of the L-2. The previously issued leather triangles had been produced by a leatherwork manufacturer. The Lodge purchased a stamp so they no longer have to be ordered.

- Most of the neckerchiefs issued by the Lodge revolve around events, either national or regional events like Jamborees, National Order of the Arrow Conferences, or Conclave, with the exceptions being N-1 and N-10.
- The special event neckerchiefs were typically used for national events such as NOAC. The red and gray colors were rotated depending on the year of the event.

- The early round patches utilizing the original Lodge's totem, the arrowhead, and two arrows are
 identifiable by the positioning of the arrows or the letters that the arrows point and the length of the
 W's legs. In R-1, which is a WAB issue, arrows point to the letters "E" in the word THE and to the "A"
 in the word ARROW. The middle legs of the W's are shorter.
- In R-2 one of the toughest R issues the arrows point to "E" in the word THE and to "A" in the word ARROW, but the middle legs of the W's are equal in length to the outer legs.
- In R-3, one of the arrows points to the space between THE and ARROW and the other arrow points to the first "R" in the word ARROW.
- In R-4, both arrows point to letters in the word ARROW.
- Some of the early R's may be found on neckerchiefs as seen in the special event neckerchief section.
- In the 60's, 70's, and early 80's, Lodge rounds were restricted to one per 16 hours of service.
- Issues R-19 and R-20 were made because the Lodge was in short supply of R-17 and R-18 for an LLD event. A rush order was made with Moritz Embroidery. Scans of R-17 and R-18 were sent to Moritz to expedite production. Due to time constraints, the production art was not reviewed, thus the loss of the ghosted FDL and poor wording. Only a very limited number of patches were produced, and after the event, the design changed.
- R-23 was designed to be placed in a Tervis Tumbler. Hearing collector's indicate that they would have to break the tumbler to access the patch for their collection notebooks, the Lodge made 292 extra patches so the tumblers would not have to be broken. Initially, only those that bought tumblers got to buy the extra patches, but others were allowed to buy the extras after a few Lodge events.
- R-32 was a Trading Post issue to complete the different branches of the military for the 2020 event set honoring our armed forces. There is no event name on the R-32, thus it is considered a round and not an event piece.



Notes:

- There is a little known variety in the S-1 First
 Flap. It has vertical stitching in the head and tail
 as well as tags on the opposite side of the W's.
- The S-3, S-4, and S-5 are the first Ordeal, Brotherhood, and Vigil series flaps of the Lodge. While the color of the head, loss or addition of the tail, or eye configuration has changed over the years, we still have maintained our OBV flaps.
- During the restriction era the 60's,
 70's, and early 80's you had to give 8 hours of service to gain the privilege to buy one flap.
- The FDL became a BSA requirement for patches in the late 70's. Needing a place to put a FDL on the flaps, the thunderbird's tail was dropped beginning with the S-6, S-7, and S-8 OBV series.
- The S-9 flap is the first over-seas embroidery flap
 of the Lodge. Apparently, there was confusion
 when the measurements were converted from
 inches to millimeters, thus the smaller size and
 naming of the flap "Micro". Lodge members did
 not like the looks of these smaller flaps, so they



were distributed to the new Ordeal members. Since there are a lot of sash and dash folks with each ordeal, these coveted flaps are few and far between. The S-9 Micro along with the S-26 1996 NOAC delegate are usually the last flaps to be acquired when collecting the Lodge's flaps due to their scarcity.

- In 1995, it was decided to put the tail back on the thunderbird after it had gone "tail-less" for more than 17 years. This was a heated battle among the Lodge's membership, but those in favor of putting the tail back on the thunderbird won out in the end with the S-22, S-23, and S-24 OBV series.
- In early 2003, patch catalogers stopped using the head coloration or the tail, or lack of tail, in their patch descriptions and started using the facial details. This began with the BSA produced S-41, S-42 and S-43, describing the thunderbird as having a triangular face. Later in the same year with Moritz Embroidery produced flaps, S-48, S-49 and S-50, the thunderbird was described as having 3 equal lines in the face.
- The colorful S-40 was the first Lodge Building fundraiser flap. It met strong opposition with the Lodge's Executive Committee because it was thought due to its colorful design, Lodge members would wear it over the Lodge's regular issue flaps. Originally, it was limited to 5/person but the restriction was later removed after several events. It also began an era of "cartooned" thunderbird patches.
- Building fundraiser flap opposition was once again met with the proposal of the monochromatic series, S-58, S-70, S-71, S-72, S-73 and S-74. It was thought that the production of all the fundraiser flaps was useless, as patches could not build a Lodge building. No, patches themselves could not make enough money to build the Lodge building, but they sure put a huge dent in the amount of money raised to complete the Sullivan Center. All of the S-58's would be sold before the others were produced. The S-74 was not a part of the original proposal but our beloved Charley passed away in 2007 and this was a commemorative issue for him. The monochromatic series has been dubbed by collectors as the "Skittles" flaps.
- The S-61 was issued for those completing 16-hours of workday service for the 2007 SR-7B
 Conclave hosted by the Lodge. There were 145 of these flaps issued and the remaining 155 flaps

- were destroyed in the Friday night campfire at 2013 Spring Inductions. This was the second time in Lodge history that patches were burned, the first being the remaining A-1's and eX1992-1 through eX1993-3 event puzzle patch pieces.
- BSA began licensing patch manufacturers in 2008 and set down some guidelines for patches. Patch
 manufacturers had to have the production art for patch reviewed and approved by BSA to ensure
 these guidelines were being met. At the time, the Lodge was using Moritz Embroidery, but Mortiz
 lost their licensing, so the Lodge began using Shelby Patch to make its patches. The S-67 and S-68
 were the first flaps that Shelby produced for the Lodge. You will note that the periods after the W's
 are now gone due to these new BSA requirements indicating that it is not proper to have the periods.
 The periods had been on our flaps since the first flap (S-1).
- S-75, S-76 and S-77 was an attempt to bring back the old Swiss embroidery style to our flaps. While
 they do not look quite like the older Swiss flaps due to modern threads, they did please the Lodge
 members so much that this became our standard issue flaps.
- In late 2010, Occoneechee Lodge followed suit of two other Order of the Arrow lodges in the fact that we raised funds for the Susan G. Komen Foundation in the fight against breast cancer by producing a "Scouting for the Cure" (S-79) flap. Since this time, there have been numerous patches produced nationally for the fight against breast cancer by Order of the Arrow lodges.
- With the diminishing supply of life member flaps (S-60), the Lodge had to follow BSA guidelines in the remake of the existing Life Member flap. Since the BSA frowns upon life membership, the basic flap design remained the same, however the wording was changed from "Life Member" to "104 Club" for the new S-82.
- S-99 was the first flap-shaped patch issued by any Lodge in Section SR-7B for a Vigil Rededication ceremony at conclave.
- S-104 was issued to commemorate the issuance of the Lodge's 104th solid embroidery flap. The "104" behind the thunderbird is glow-in-the-dark thread.
- The S-116 Arrow Tour flap is individually numbered 01 104 in gold mylar. Eight additional numbers, 117, 118, 134, 188, 296, 331, 459, and 560 were added into the production in hopes of drawing in people from the various lodges across the State.
- The S-145, S-146, and S-155 added a basket weave background and an arrow to the standard Ordeal, Brotherhood and Vigil flaps. This is the first significant change to the standard issues in 23 years.

Notes:

- Woven patches were popular with many Lodges in the early 70's. Occoneechee's first wovens –
 W-1, W-2, and W-3 would not be made until 1982 for the Lodge's 45th Anniversary.
- The Lodge again made an OBV set of woven's W-4, W-5, and W-6 in 1997 for the Lodge's 60th
 Anniversary.
- W-7, W-8, W-9, and W-10 were made for conclave service hours in 2001.
- The 2014 and 2015 Trade-O-Ree event flaps were woven, but they are catalogued as event patches (eW2014-7 and eW2015-5).
- The W-13, W-14, W-15 OBV series was issued for the Lodge's 80th anniversary in 2017. They were
 made by MBC Badges in England.
- W-20 was made to commemorate our totem's ancestry. The thunderbird design we use today has been used since 1952, debuting on the R-5 and is credited to Clyde Wheeler, however the thunderbird art was taken from art discovered at an archeological site of the Sikyatki village of the Hopi Indian Tribe. Since there was too much detail in the Sikyatki design for embroidery, the design had to be simplified for use on our patches.



- Many of the Lodge's odd shapes are the bottom pieces to 2-piece patch sets that became popular in the mid to late 90's.
- X-27 was the Lodge's first regular issue CSP that did not involve NOAC.
- BSA licensing played a role in the design change when a remake of the X-13 Elangomat Chief's
 head patch was needed due to supply. The new X-56 Elangomat Chief's head would need a FDL on
 the patch. Another change was to make the feathers on the bonnet felt in order to look more feather
 like.

- On the cutting edge again, Occoneechee made epaulet appliqués (X-63) for the 2012 SR-7B conclave as a spirit item. Each delegate was given a pair of the appliqués to apply to their epaulets. These patches may be an unknowing sleeper odd shape for future collectors since many of them were applied to the epaulets and were not thought of as patches.
- The "Thunderformer," X-67, X-68, X-69, X-70, and X-71 are a first of its kind. Revealed by our delegates at the 2012 NOAC, the X-67 car transforms into a robot like thunderbird utilizing snaps to make the transformation.
- The X-74 was issued as a 75th anniversary piece for the "Thunderformer." Issued at Winter Banquet in 2012. The Grinch Head could replace the existing Thunderformer head and be utilized as a Christmas ornament.
- The X-73 and X-76 were issued for 2013 Conclave Workdays in a style of the old "Workhorse Weekend" patches. The X-73 was issued for the participant's first and second workday, one patch for each day. By working 3-workdays you earned your conclave host T-shirt. You had to work 4-workdays to earn the X-76 patch.
- Since the J-2 is a Chapter issued patch, the X-77 was the first patch issued by the Lodge with individual embroidered numbers 001 – 200. This patch was issued to help raise funds for the fireworks show for 2013 SR-7B Conclave hosted by Occoneechee Lodge.
- The X-84 "We R Dun, Gone Fishin" patch was issued as a "Thank You" to those serving on a 2013 Host Lodge Conclave Committee. This patch took us from hosting the SR-7B Conclave and nicely tied us in to the Council's National Jamboree theme of "Freshwater Game Fish."
- Unlike the questionable F-22, the X-118 baseball bat was made for spirit wear on the uniform for the 2018 SR-7B conclave, thus no question that it is in fact a true odd shape.
- It was decided that the Elangomat date rockers would no longer be used and thus they were
 discontinued after the 2017 Fall Fellowship, even though the Lodge had a 2018 date strip on hand
 for use in 2018. The Elangomat date rockers were replaced by the X-119 and X-121 and first used in
 2018.
- The X-128 "Pillow Patch" was a Trading Post patch item for sale when Occoneechee Lodge hosted
 the 2019 SR-7B Conclave at Camp Durant. It was a great idea, but didn't sell well as collectors said
 it wouldn't fit in their collection notebooks. Most of the X-128 patches were given away at later
 events for those making a purchase at the Trading Post.
- For the 2022 NOAC, the Lodge's theme was "Salute to Ft. Bragg." The longtime name of the military base would be changing to Ft. Liberty in 2023-2024. The X-131, X-132, and X-133 chevrons give tribute to the old Ft. Bragg name, the 82nd Airborne and Special Forces.
- The X-134 and X-135 Christmas snow globe ornament patches were first sold at the 2021 Winter Banquet. The X-134 was a mistake by Shelby Patch as one side had a blue border and the other side had a white border. Both borders were supposed to be white. The Lodge accepted the order at a reduced cost and sold both patches.
- Elangomat segments were used starting in 1999 (X-14) and continued until 2017. The lodge switched to red (X-119) and white (X-121) ghost patches starting in 2018. When the original segments were ordered, multiple years were ordered at one time. The 2018 segments were never issued, but several ended up in collections. The lodge decided to issue the 2018 segment (X-141) at the 2023 Fall Fellowship to liquidate the inventory.



Notes:

- The first event patch eX1965-1 was issued some 28 years after the formation of Occoneechee Lodge 104. For some years there are only a few patches made for the year, thus it is thought that some served for multiple events for the respective year and it would not be until more recent time that there would be a different patch issued for each of the Lodge's various events.
- eZR1977-4 is listed in this guide as a fake. Story has it that a Lodge member/ Ft. Bragg soldier from the Fayetteville area made it because he did not get the Fall Fellowship patch eR1977-3 so he ordered 50 of the eZR1977-4's. Generally in the late 70's and the 80's, patch orders were for a limited amount and many times the event patches were given out on Sunday morning at breakfast, so if you were not there or you were last in line, you might not have received a patch.
- The 1980's event patches are probably the toughest to collect due to diminishing membership in scouting during this time period.

- The Winter Banquet **eX1985-4** was the first Winter Banquet event patch. The next Winter Banquet event patch, the **eX2003-4** snowman, would not be made for another 18 years.
- John Blackfeather Jefferies and Carlton McKee designed the 1992-1993 arrowhead puzzle set. John was working as the night dispatcher for Piedmont Electric and Carlton went to his workplace one night around 10 pm with an S1. Carlton told him he wanted the S1 shape to be the base of an arrowhead. They went from there and finished it around 1 o'clock. When Southern Emblem made it, they cut the size for a reason that was never conveyed. The 1993 conclave flaps (S17, S18) were supposed to be the same size as the S1. John "signed" the patch with the black feather seen in ex1992-1. The event with the bird with the tomahawk (ex1992-3) is a tribute to Fred Robinson "retiring as Lodge Advisor". Fred's Vigil name is Warrior Woodpecker. Extra eX1992-1 through eX1993-3 arrowhead puzzle patches were burned due to controversy over people not being able to obtain some of the pieces to complete the puzzle. This was possibly the first time that patches were purposely destroyed by the Lodge.
- The FDL event patches, eX2005-3, eX2009-1, eX2009-2, eX2009-3, and eX2009-4 were made to complement the monochromatic flaps (S-58, S-70, S-71, S-72, S-73, and S-74) and are known as the Charlie Sullivan Set. Separated by 4-years in their issuance, the 2009 event patches fell under new BSA Licensing guidelines, and even though they were FDL in shape, BSA required that these patches have a FDL placed on them.
- While some think that the eX2006-2a and eX2006-2b were a mistake in the button loop location, it was actually done on purpose to promote trading of patches amongst the Lodge's membership.
- A fun chant amongst the Lodge youth when Rodney McDonald was Lodge Adviser was "Whoz Ya Daddy Rodney Mac." The eX2007-5 was a surprise patch at the 2007 Winter Banquet to pay tribute to Rodney's tenure as Lodge Adviser.
- The eJ2010-5 event jacket patch was the first of its kind for Lodge 104. The jacket patch was spurred from the 2010 event puzzle pieces eX2010-1, eX2010-2, eX2010-3, and eX2010-4 as the Lodge membership liked the design so much, they wanted one with all the pieces attached, thus the jacket patch was made.
- The eR2011-4 Vigil Gathering patch was the very first patch made for this Vigil honor-only event.
- The 2012 event patch series, eA2012-1, eA2012-2, eA2012-3, eA2012-4, and eA2012-5
 were made to give a historical lesson of some of the Lodge's patches during our 75th
 Anniversary year.
- The eX2013-10 was to be the last Winter Banquet patch issued as the Lodge's Executive
 Committee voted to eliminate the long running first weekend in December event at the 2013
 Lodge Leadership Development. The event, which would replace Winter Banquet, would be
 called Fall Gathering and Banquet to be held in October. For a number of reasons, the Fall
 Gathering and Banquet event did not last long as the winter Banquet event returned in
 December 2016 with eX2016-10.
- The eR2014-4b (white back variety) was discovered after issuing about 2-3 of the 2014 All Events set to the 66 members who purchased the All Events Package. Most of backings of

the wheel portion had a black backing (eR2014-4a), however there were 10 wheels that had a white backing.

- The intent of issues eX2014-9 and ex2014-10 were that they be issued for the Council Camporee as a Council event patch. However, lacking the event name on them and just "Occoneechee" along with the ghosted WWW and the thunderbird totem put them in the Lodge event patch category as the Lodge's LEC did approve the thunderbird to be on them since the Lodge hosted the event. Some people feel they should be in the "Questionable Issue" category, so collect as you see fit.
- The eARM2016-5 was issued by the Lodge to identify the 2016 Trade-O-Ree staff in case someone needed assistance while attending the event. This was the first ever armband issued by the Lodge. One hundred were made, one was given to the TOR staff. The remainder were sold after the event to staff members.
- Due to COVID 19 in 2020 literally hundreds of event patches were left over as the Lodge purchased all of the event patches for the year before the on-set of the virus prior to Pow-Wow and other events were cancelled. Thus eR2020-1, eR2020-2, eR2020-4, and eR2020-6 are all over the place as they have been sold on the Lodge's online store and in Trading Post grab bags.
- The eS2022-7 flap was created due to a small fire at the Grand Lodge during the 2022 Trade-O-Ree. When the a/c came on that night, it filled the Grand Lodge with smoke and everyone was evacuated from the building. The Eagle Springs FD rolled in as well as Moore County Deputies to investigate. It was discovered that an electrical part in the HVAC system had failed and burned causing the smoke to be expelled into the building. The Lodge Adviser proclaimed that "Our TOR's are so hot, we bring in the FD." The patch was first sold at Winter Banquet.

There are several 50-miler patches that are questionable. These were Council sponsored events, but typically staffed by arrowmen, thus the reference to the Lodge. The Executive Committee (EC) never approved the above patches, and they were paid for by the Council as it was a Council sponsored event. The 50-miler patches listed in the event section of this Guide – eX2006-5, eX2006-6, eR2011-4, eR2011-6, eR2012-5, eR2012-6, eR2012-7, eR2013-5, eR2013-6, eR2013-7, eR2013-8, eR2013-9, eX2014-13, eX2014-14, eR2015-9, eR2015-10, and eR2016-1 – all had EC approval and were made and paid for by the Lodge.













